



Head of Prop Making (Full Time) Job Description

Overview

We are seeking a Head of Prop Making to join our team. This role is part of a team of full-time and part-time staff that are responsible for the teaching and delivery of technical courses and the smooth running of The Lir Academy's resources

The Lir Academy is the National Academy of Dramatic Art at Trinity College Dublin. Our aim is to train young stage managers, theatre technicians, actors, designers, directors, and playwrights to the highest international standards for careers in the theatre and allied professions.

Training at the Lir is significantly practise based and to facilitate this we produce 10 plays and 2 films with the undergraduate technical students and final year acting students each year. Alongside this there is the delivery of classes and technical support provided to the internal acting projects and external collaborations.

Role summary

The Lir is looking for someone with commitment and passion for educating students in theatre and the broader world of entertainment. The Head of Prop Making will deliver training and mentoring to technical students, oversee students work on Lir productions. Work on Lir productions and be part of the venue technical team.

Main duties and responsibilities

Prop Making

- Train and mentor technical students in prop making and related skills.
- Lead classes on relevant topics.
- Provide hands-on ongoing tuition to students on prop making projects as part of their training.
- Provide hands-on ongoing tuition to students in the lead up to, run of, and get out for Lir productions.





- Liaise with designers and the production manager to ensure the smooth running and delivery of shows.
- Give accurate costings of costs and manage the ordering of materials within schedule and budget.
- Oversee the upkeep and maintenance of the workshop and the associated technical equipment.
- Work on Lir productions as the need arises.
- Deliver training to other students of The Lir.
- Based on successful candidates' individual strengths there will be opportunities to work within other technical departments.

Other responsibilities

- Be a part of the SMTT (Stage Management and Technical Theatre) training team and contribute to the development and delivery of technical training to an international standard.
- Ensure that The Lir is a safe working environment and that the Lir's health & safety policies are followed.
- Other duties as required by the Director of Technical Training.

Terms and conditions of employment

- The position is offered as a one-year contract with a 6-month probationary period. The working days are Monday to Friday and may include some weekends.
- The Head of Prop Making will report directly to the Director of Technical Training.
