## \_ ABOUT THE PLAY

Tony Kushner's 1985 "free adaptation" of *The Illusion* is taken from *L'Illusion Comique*, a French baroque comedic play written by Pierre Corneille in 1636. Now considered part of the canon of great European drama, Corneille's play was far ahead of its time in its use of metatheatricality. This is all the more extraordinary when we consider Corneille was only 29 when he wrote it and this was already his seventh play.

Tony Kushner's adaptation, whilst free in its poetic license, remains true to the spirit of theatrical adventure and the remarkable twists and turns. of Corneille's plot. Like the original, it is part fantasy, part "smoke and mirrors", part psychological metaphor. The central quest of a dying father seeking help from a wizard to help him find his errant son leaps centuries and theatrical conventions just as Corneille's original, but the underlying questions around the narratives we create to make sense. of our "reality" and the chances of us ever really understanding the motives of those around us, are expertly handled by Kushner.

Theatre is the perfect vehicle for a play that questions notions of reality and our relationship to it and both Kushner and Corneille revel in theatricality and its power to enthrall and dazzle.

If the fiction that we watch on stage can make us gasp and weep, how can we ever trust our response to reality and the "magicians" who we turn to for answers?

Perhaps it's all an illusion.
